

PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

Nirmal Haloi College came in to existence on July 30, 1979 through the untiring efforts of a group of visionaries of the locality surrounding Patacharkuchi.

At the time of foundation, the institution was named 'Pragjyoti College'. 'Pracchya Sangha', the oldest sport and socio-cultural organization at Patacharkuchi, made the dream of the visionaries a reality by offering the entire set-up for all the administrative and academic functions of the college. The college was shifted to its present location in March 1988.

The first batch of students, comprising 52 boys and girls, was admitted into the Pre-University (PU, now HS) class on 30/07/1979; of the total 52 students 28 were boys and 24 girls.

An eminent teacher of History at Bajali College Late Krishna Kanta Goswami was the founder Principal. At the initial stage there were no permanent faculties. Some selfless and dedicated teachers of Patacharkuchi Vidyapith H.S. School, imparted teaching without any remuneration.

- B. A. Course was introduced in the year 1985 with 32 students on the roll. Of the total students enrolled, 20 were boys and 12 were Girls. The first batch appeared at the final examination in 1988.
- B. Com. course is introduced as self financing in 2017 with Major.

The college got permanent affiliation of B. A. Part-I of Gauhati University in 1987 and B. A. Part-II in 1989. College came under Grants-in-aid system in 11th January, 1996.

N. H. College was assessed by NAAC in 2005 and was accredited C++.

The college came under Assam College Provincialisation Act. in 2005.

It came under 2(f) and 12(B) of UGC in Nov, 2007.

NAAC again assessed and accredited the college in second cycle accreditation in 2016 and awarded Grade "B".

At present, approximately one thousand five hundred students are pursuing education at the under graduate and H. S. level.

FOUR-YEAR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMME (FYUGP)

The Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) is divided into two parts — (i) Core Courses and (ii) Common Courses. Students of FYUGP can study different core courses. The Core Courses have to be chosen among the subjects offered given below. While the common courses are to be studied by all students alike and all-together they carry total credits of 36 over a 3-year period. Total minimum credit requirement is 84 for the Core Courses, which comes to a total of minimum 120 credits for a 3-year programme. With the fourth year, the minimum credit requirement becomes 160.



Course Progression:





 - d) Caste Certificate. (if applicable)
 - e) Gap Certificate. (if applicable)
 - f) Income Certificate issued by concerned Circle Officer for admission under fee waiver scheme (Parental income <2Lakhs)
 - g) Any other relevant documents.

Code of Conduct for students:

The students must wear college uniform within the campus during working hours.

As per the UGC Guideline [No. F1-16/2007 (CPP-II), April, 2009] all forms of ragging in hostel and the college campus are prohibited. Ragging is considered as a cognizable under the law of the land and ragging in all its forms is totally banned in the entire institution, including its departments, constituent units, all its premises (academic, residential, sports, canteen etc.) whether located within the

campus or outside and in all means of transportation of

students whether public or private. Punishable ingredients of ragging are (1) Abetment of ragging, (2) Criminal of ragging and (3) Unlawful assembly and rioting while conspiracy to the while ranging (4) Public nuisance created during ragging, (5) Violation of decency and morals through ragging, (6) Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt, (7) Wrongful to vouy, tansing the confinement, (9) Use of criminal restraint, (8) Wrongful confinement, (9) force, (10) Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences, (11) Extortion, (12) Criminal trespass, (13) offences against property, (14) Criminal intimidation, (15) Attempts to commit any or all to the above mentioned offences against the victim(s), (16) Physical or psychological bumiliation, (17) All other offences following from the definition of 'Ragging'.

The College Authority has set up an empowered "Anti-

Ragging Committee".

6. College identity cards are issued annually. Old identity cards are to be surrendered at the end of each academic year for renewal. In case of loss of identity card, duplicate ID may be issued on payment of prescribed fees.

Department of Economics

The department of economics is one of the original departments of N. H. College which was established in 1979. Initially classes were held in the Prachya Sangha. The department shifted to the present college area in and subsequently shifted to the east part of the college campus in 2003.

Initially teaching was started in the department with an intake of less than 50 students in the H S class. The intake had to be raised up to 225 in response to growing demand for under graduate education in economics in the college. However the intake had to be pegged back to 20 due to implementation of mathematical application in economics. At present the intake increases to more than 25.

In view of the growing demand for post graduate learning in economics the college offers the option of M A in economics under the distance education programme in IDOL offered by G.U.

The department started functioning with only one teacher named Mr. Suresh Sharma. Subsequently Sri Bhabesh Das and Sri Jagadish Kalita Late Mahan ch. Kalita etc. joined the department.

Right from the beginning the teachers of the deptt. were associated with various assignment. Dr. Suresh Sarma joined in M.C. College, Dr. Jagadish Kalita joined N.K. College. Dr. Manikanta Das was appointed as principal i/c in this College (1996-1997). Teachers of the department have also extended their services in the different social activities.


