



PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

Nirmal Haloi College came in to existence on July 30, 1979 through the untiring efforts of a group of visionaries of the locality surrounding Patacharkuchi.

At the time of foundation, the institution was named 'Pragjyoti College'. 'Pracchya Sangha', the oldest sport and socio-cultural organization at Patacharkuchi, made the dream of the visionaries a reality by offering the entire set-up for all the administrative and academic functions of the college. The college was shifted to its present location in March 1988.

The first batch of students, comprising 52 boys and girls, was admitted into the Pre-University (PU, now HS) class on 30/07/1979; of the total 52 students 28 were boys and 24 girls.

An eminent teacher of History at Bajali College Late Krishna Kanta Goswami was the founder Principal. At the initial stage there were no permanent faculties. Some selfless and dedicated teachers of Patacharkuchi Vidyapith H.S. School, imparted teaching without any remuneration.

- B. A. Course was introduced in the year 1985 with 32 students on the roll. Of the total students enrolled, 20 were boys and 12 were Girls. The first batch appeared at the final examination in 1988.
- B. Com. in 2017 with Major Course.

The college got permanent affiliation of B. A. Part-I of Gauhati University in 1987 and B. A. Part-II in 1989. College came under Grants-in-aid system in 11th January, 1996.

N. H. College was assessed by NAAC in 2005 and was accredited C++.

The college came under Assam College Provincialisation Act. in 2005.

It came under 2(f) and 12(B) of UGC in Nov, 2007.

NAAC again assessed and accredited the college in second cycle accreditation in 2016 and awarded Grade "B".

At present, approximately one thousand five hundred students are pursuing education at the under graduate and H. S. level.

What is UG-CBCS?

The undergraduate degree (UG) programme in the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) will have courses spread across six-semesters of any undergraduate degree course. Two consecutive (one odd and one even) semesters will make up an academic year. An UG course shall be of Six Semesters covering three Calendar Years (Academic Sessions - June to May). The duration of the Odd Semesters (First, Third, and Fifth) shall be June - November, and that of Even Semesters (Second, Fourth and Sixth) shall be December - May.

How does it work?

The courses in GU UG-CBCS are categorised primarily into three types of courses - Core, Elective, and Ability / Skill Enhancement courses. All the core and elective courses will comprise of six (6) credits and the skill courses are of four (4) credits.

Core Course -

As the name suggests, a core course is a necessary course that a student MUST take in order to complete the degree. The number of core courses for Honours and Regular degrees are different.



A bird eye view of the Department: The sole mission to establish Nirmal Haloi College (earlier Pragjyoti College) is to provide education for the poor and disadvantaged with accessibility to higher education by bringing the education to the doorstep. Keeping the mission in front the Department of History was established from the time of inception. The founder of the institution realized the importance of the subject as the famous historians realized- what men have done and said and above all what they have taught. Establishment of the Department has been done, but the problem of getting the qualified teachers was the major problem. 




