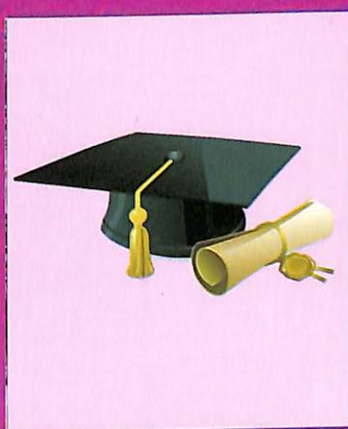

## PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

Nirmal Haloi College came into existence on July 30, 1979 through the untiring efforts of a group of visionaries of the locality surrounding Patacharkuchi.

At the time of foundation, the institution was named 'Pragjyoti College'. 'Pracchya Sangha', the oldest sport and socio-cultural organization at Patacharkuchi, made the dream of the visionaries a reality by offering the entire set-up for all the administrative and academic functions of the college. The college was shifted to its present location in March 1988.

The first batch of students, comprising 52 boys and girls, was admitted into the Pre-University (PU, now HS) class on 30/07/1979; of the total 52 students 28 were boys and 24 girls.

An eminent teacher of History at Bajali College Late Krishna Kanta Goswami was the founder Principal. At the initial stage there were no permanent faculties. Some selfless and dedicated teachers of Patacharkuchi Vidyapith H.S. School, imparted teaching without any remuneration.

B. A. Course was introduced in the year 1985 with 32 students on the roll. Of the total students enrolled, 20 were boys and 12 were Girls. The first batch appeared at the final examination in 1988.

B. Com. in 2017 with Major Course.

The college got permanent affiliation of B. A. Part-I of Gauhati University in 1987 and B. A. Part-II in 1989. College came under Grants-in-aid system in 11<sup>th</sup> January, 1996.

N. H. College was assessed by NAAC in 2005 and was accredited C++.

The college came under Assam College Provincialisation Act. in 2005.

It came under 2(f) and 12(B) of UGC in Nov, 2007.

NAAC again assessed and accredited the college in second cycle accreditation in 2016 and awarded Grade "B".

At present, approximately one thousand five hundred students are pursuing education at the under graduate and H. S. level.

The three year (six semesters) programme leads to the Degree in Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) and Bachelor of commerce (B.Com.)

## GU UG-CBCS =

### What is UG-CBCS ?

The undergraduate degree (UG) programme in the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) will have courses spread across six-semester of any undergraduate degree course. Two consecutive (one odd and one even) semesters will make up an academic year. An UG course shall be of Six Semesters covering three Calendar Years (Academic Sessions – June to May). The duration of the Odd Semesters (First, Third, and Fifth) shall be June - November, and that of Even Semesters (Second, Fourth and Sixth) shall be December - May.

### How does it work ?

The courses in GU UG-CBCS are categorised primarily into three types of courses - Core, Elective, and Ability / Skill Enhancement courses. All the core and elective courses will comprise of six (6) credits and the skill courses are of four (4) credits.

### Core Course -

As the name suggests, a core course is a necessary course that a student MUST take in order to complete the degree. The number of core courses for Honours and Regular degrees are different.





### Elective Course

An elective course is the one for which a student has some kind of freedom to choose from a pool of courses. There are two kinds of elective courses - Generic and Discipline Specific. The generic elective courses are those, which can be chosen by a student belonging to any stream, while the discipline specific elective courses are particular to only the discipline concerned. However, a student pursuing an honours degree course can choose a generic elective from any other discipline except from the honours course itself.

### Ability / Skill Enhancement Course

An Ability or Skill Enhancement course is aimed at providing the student with skill and ability. These courses have four (4) credits each in contrast to the core or elective courses. The ability enhancement courses MUST be opted by a student and the student can choose papers from a pool of skill enhancement courses.

### Dissertation / Project

A student can opt (subject to conditions) a dissertation or a project work in lieu of a 6-credit discipline specific elective course in the sixth semester.

### The Notion of Credit

A student needs to earn a required number of credits in order to successfully complete a degree. The credit is closely related to the number of stipulated classes a student has to complete. The following table indicates the number of credit a student can earn for each type of indicated classes.

## Admission Procedure

- N. H. College encourages a transparent admission procedure. Application form for admission into the college can be collected from the college office during working hours or it may be download from the college web - [www.nirmalhaloicollege.in](http://www.nirmalhaloicollege.in).
- An attested copy of the mark sheet of the qualifying examinations must be enclosed with the application form.
- Admission in to the college is made strictly in order of merit and is governed by the college authority. The Principal's decision regarding admission is final.
- No pressure or interference from any quarter for the admission of a particular student shall be entertained.
- Eligible candidates have to produce at the time of interview and admission the following testimonials in original.
  - Mark sheet of the last qualifying examinations
  - Valid age proof document.
  - Character Certificate from the head of the institution last attended.
  - Caste Certificate. (if applicable)
  - Gap Certificate. (if applicable)
  - Any other relevant documents.
  - Valid income certificate for BPL Students.
- Selection of candidates for admission in to B.A./B.Com is made in order of merit on the basis of marks obtained in 10+2 final examination. Lists of eligible candidates are displayed on the college notice board at least three (3) days prior to admission.
- At the under graduate level, admission is open for two shifts - day shift and morning shift and at the H.S. level admission is held for day shift alone.
- Reservation rules are followed as per Government directives.
- Seats of **absent** candidates on the scheduled date shall be forfeited and adjusted from the candidates in the waiting list.
- The College has a provision for reservation of seats as per Government of Assam rules :

## General information :

- Students who do not attend at least 75% of the total number of classes in each paper (Both theory and practical classes separately) will not be allowed to appear in the final examination.
- Students who fail to attend their classes for a certain period of time at a stretch on genuine, reasonable, and acceptable grounds such as serious diseases or accidents and related treatment involving themselves and members of their family, death of near and dear ones, academic/ sports/ cultural activities approved by the college etc. must apply, in writing to the Head of the Department concerned for consideration of exemption of the absence for the period, immediately after such absence. Application must be supported with testimonials/ documents wherever necessary. However, such applications will be considered if and only if the student has the requisite 75% class attendance till the last date he/ she has attended classes. Even for such cases the actual attendance must not fall short of 50%.
- Students failing to attend classes for 15 days at a stretch in the first month of commencement of classes will forfeit their seats.
- Great emphasis is laid on discipline and character building of students and they are expected to maintain a high standard of discipline. They are subject to the rules and regulations of the College and Hostel.
- Students admitted to the College must abide by all rules and regulations as prescribed by the College Authority. Violation of rules, unsatisfactory progress, irregular attendance, irregular clearance of college and hostel fees, showing discourtesy to the teachers and staff members in any form, adoption of unfair means during examinations etc. are some of the offences which may make students liable for disciplinary action like termination of scholarship, non-awards of college diploma, forced transfer and even expulsion from the college and hostel.

### Library Rules

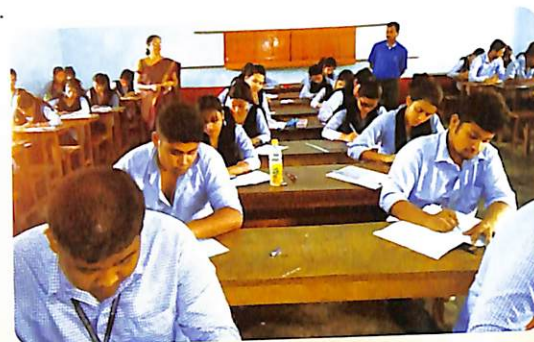
### Examination Rules :

- i) Internal Assessment : The examination board conducts internal examinations for periodic assessment of the students of both even and odd semesters at convenient dates. Credits are as per G.U. Examination rules.
- ii) University Examinations : The Principal constitutes a separate external examination committee for conducting University Examinations as scheduled by the concerned University with members of faculty (three or four) and members of non-teaching staff (two or three).

### Evaluation :

- i) Internal Assessment: The answer scripts of internal assessment are evaluated internally, i.e. by the faculty members of the concerned department. Complete records of marks along with the evaluated answer scripts are despatched to the parent University.
- ii) External Assessment: As per University guidelines, the answer scripts of University Examinations are despatched to the specified evaluation Zones.

It is mandatory for students to appear in all the examinations conducted by the college during an academic year and attend classes regularly; the minimum percentage of attendance is 75% of classes held. There is provision for sick bed to sick students during the examinations.

### Department of Economics

The department of economics is one of the original departments of N. H. College which was established in 1979. Initially classes were held in the Prachya Sangha. The department shifted to the present college area in and subsequently shifted to the east part of the college campus in 2003.

Initially teaching was started in the department with an intake of less than 50 students in the H S class. The intake had to be raised up to 225 in response to growing demand for under graduate education in economics in the college. However the intake had to be pegged back to 20 due to implementation of mathematical application in economics. At present the intake increases to more than 25.

In view of the growing demand for post graduate learning in economics the college offers the option of M A in economics under the distance education programme in IDOL offered by G.U.

The department started functioning with only one teacher named Mr. Suresh Sharma. Subsequently Sri Bhabesh Das and Sri Jagadish Kalita Late Mahan ch. Kalita etc. joined the department.

Right from the beginning the teachers of the deptt. were associated with various assignment. Dr. Suresh Sarma joined in M C College, Dr. Jagadish Kalita joined N.K. College. Dr. Manikanta Das was appointed as principal i/c in this College (1996-1997). Teachers of the department have also extended their services in the different social activities.

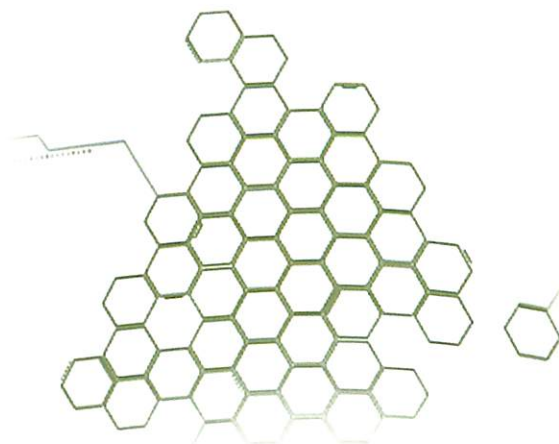

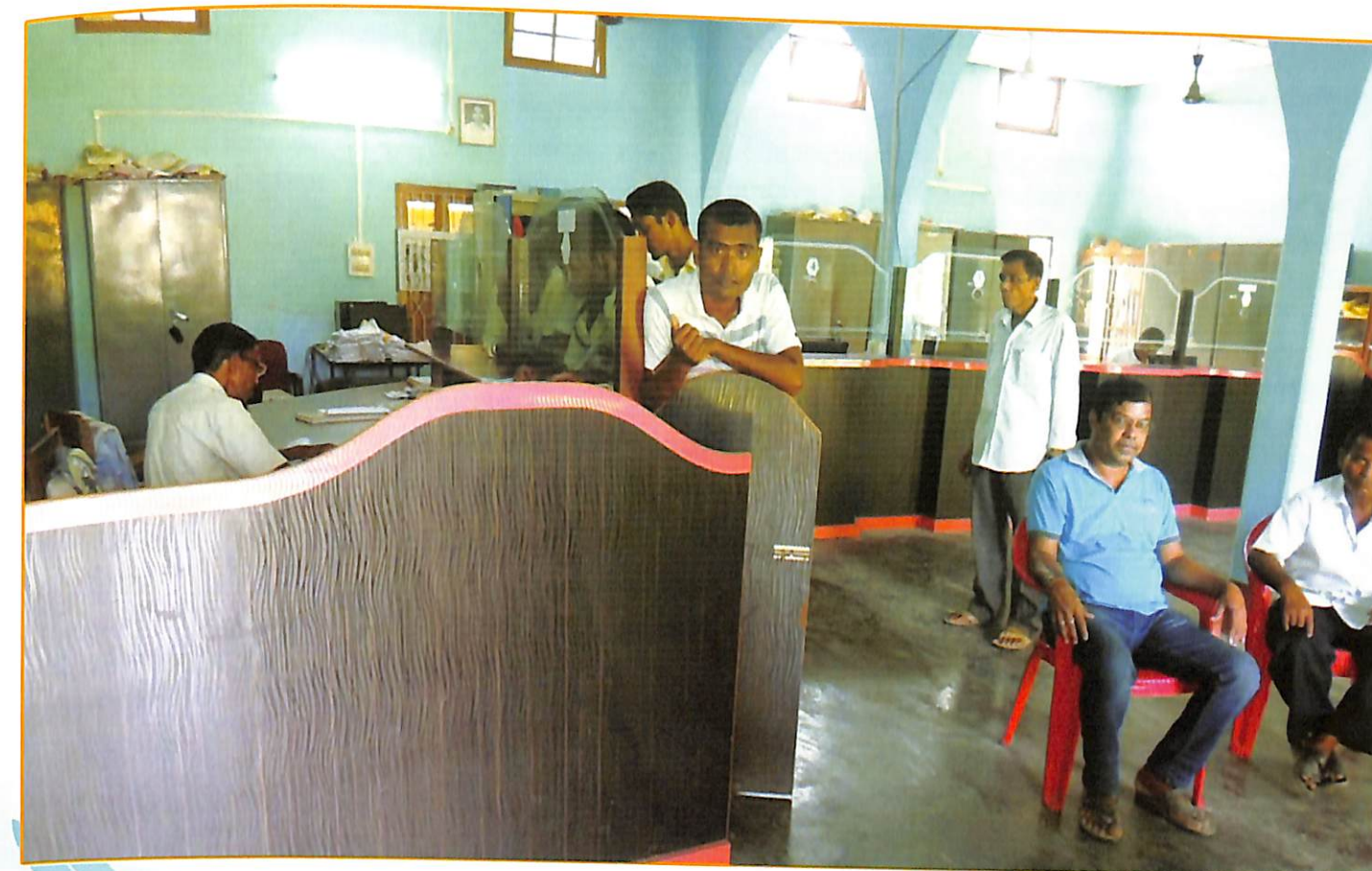
